Annual return for the financial year ended 31 March 2015

Local councils in England with an annual turnover of £6.5 million or less must complete an annual return in accordance with proper practices summarising their activities at the end of each financial year. In this annual return the term 'local council' includes a Parish Meeting, a Parish Council and a Town Council.

The annual return on pages 2 to 5 is made up of four sections:

- Sections 1 and 2 are completed by the person nominated by the local council.
- Section 3 is completed by the external auditor appointed by the Audit Commission.
- Section 4 is completed by the local council's internal audit provider.

Each council must approve this annual return no later than 30 June 2015.

Completing your annual return

Guidance notes, including a completion checklist, are provided on page 6 and at relevant points in the annual return.

Complete all sections highlighted in green. Do not leave any green box blank. Incomplete or incorrect returns require additional external audit work and may incur additional costs.

Send the annual return, together with your bank reconciliation as at 31 March 2015, an explanation of any significant year on year variances in the accounting statements and any additional information requested, to your external auditor by the due date.

Your external auditor will identify and ask for any additional documents needed for their work. Therefore, unless requested, do not send any original financial records to the external auditor.

Once the auditor has completed their work, certified annual returns will be returned to the local council for publication or public display of sections 1, 2 and 3. You must publish or display the annual return, including the external auditor's report, by 30 September 2015.

It should not be necessary for you to contact the external auditor for guidance.



Guidance notes on completing the 2014/15 annual return

- You must apply proper practices for preparing this annual return. Proper practices are found in the Practitioners' Guide* which is updated from time to time and contains everything you should need to prepare successfully for your financial year-end and the subsequent audit. Both NALC and SLCC have helplines if you want to talk through any problem you encounter.
- 2 Make sure that your annual return is complete (i.e. no empty green boxes), and is properly signed and dated. Avoid making any amendments to the completed return. But, if this is unavoidable, make sure the amendments are drawn to the attention of and approved by the council, properly initialled and an explanation is provided to the external auditor. Annual returns containing unapproved or unexplained amendments will be returned unaudited and may incur additional costs.

- Explain fully significant variances in the accounting statements on page 2. Do not just send in a copy of your detailed accounting records instead of this explanation. The external auditor wants to know that you understand the reasons for all variances. Include complete analysis to support your explanation. There are a number of examples provided in the Practitioners' Guide* to assist you.
- 7 If the external auditor has to review unsolicited information, or receives an incomplete bank reconciliation, or you do not fully explain variances, this may incur additional costs for which the auditor will make a charge.

Matters reported

Council Tax Support Grant 2013/14

We reported in our 2013/14 audit report that Council Tax Support Grant of £1,507 had been incorrectly included in Box 2. The council has again incorrectly included Council Tax Support Grant of £2,238 in Box 2 for 2014/15 and has not restated the comparative figures for 2013/14.

The council has not taken appropriate action on all matters raised in reports from the external auditor. In our view the correct response to assertion 7 on Section 2 of the Annual Return is "No".

Late Approval of Accounts

The Accounts and Audit (England) Regulations 2011 require that local councils approve Section 1 of the Annual Return by 30th June 2015 following the year ended 31 March 2015.


Fiskerton Parish Council has not complied with this requirement.

Internal Controls

The council has not maintained appropriate accounting records during the year 2014/15 and did not have adequate internal controls in place throughout the year. There were no checks in place to ensure the number of hours worked by the clerk were correct and the amount being paid was correct.

The correct response for assertion 2, section 2 is "No".

However, the internal audit has confirmed that the correct amounts were paid. The council has taken action on these matters since the year end and now all records are up to date and properly accounted for.

Overdrafts


We note that the closing cash book balances on the current account at 31 March 2015 were negative on deduction of outstanding cheques.

Although the balance in the bank at the year end is not overdrawn our audit work has indicated that there are control weaknesses in the transfer of monies between reserve and current accounts.

We would remind the council that internal financial control arrangements should be reviewed to ensure that procedures are in place to make the council aware of the financial and legal implications of their spending decisions and the timing of them and to avoid unauthorised borrowing occurring

Please note the Local Government Act 1972 (LGA 1972) Schedule 13 paragraph 10 limits temporary borrowing by local councils to two specific circumstances as follows:

- a. For the purpose of defraying expenses (including the payment of sums due by them to meet the expenses of other authorities) pending the receipt of revenues receivable by them in respect of the period of account in which those expenses are chargeable;
- b. For the purpose of defraying, pending the raising of a loan which the authority have been authorised to raise, expenses intended to be defrayed by means of the loan.

Precept payment in box 3

The council made a precept request of £12,762. As in previous years £100 of this has been funded by West Lindsey District Council. In our 2014 audit report we included as an other matter that this £100 was part of the precept and should be included in Box 2- the annual precept.

We have received further clarification from West Lindsey District Council about the method of funding of the £100. In light of this additional information, we have concluded that the £100 is a grant and should be included in Box $3\,$ - other receipts.
