Unfortunately, we don't have a school representative who is able to attend the meeting but I have written a short report for you to share with the parish councillors.

As you can imagine it has been a very difficult time, over the last two school years, dealing with the pandemic and all the restrictions that have been in place.

As a school we would like to continue to build good relationships the parish council and the village as a whole.

Over the course of the pandemic we wrote postcards to some of the village community, delivered treat parcels and tried to stay connected where possible and when it was safe and advisable to do so.

As we start a new school year we are continuing with some restrictions within school, the government guidance says that we can basically go back to normal, however we feel this is the correct approach to take in order to do our best to keep everyone as safe as possible. At school we are already seeing positive cases of Covid which is very concerning as you can imagine.

We have 86 children in the main school and 8 children currently in our pre-school. We have four classes and they are mixed year groups. We aim to give our pupils a wide range of activities to support their learning. As a church school we also focus on Christian values that will support children in their education but also in life. Our value for this term is Thankfulness. As part of our school vision we aim to be an inclusive school.
